This week's focus: Carn Brea class

You may have heard on the news yesterday that Ofsted have published a report on the standards of education in reception classes in England. The report states that, 'one third of children are failed in the first year' as well as making several recommendations:



- ensure that when children are learning to write, resources are suitable for their stage of development
- ensure they are taught correct pencil grip and how to sit correctly at a table
- attach greater importance to the teaching of numbers and counting, recognising small numbers of items, comparing numbers and solving problems
- provide frequent opportunities for children to practise and consolidate their skills

When I read the report yesterday morning, I felt very proud of our reception provision. I have seen the high standards already achieved in writing in their writing books, on the walls, outside in the sandpit or in the class floor book. The children have **performed their own stories for me or brought in videos of themselves retelling those stories at home**. I have had the privilege to watch as the children **learn their phonics using 'Fred' talk**. I have seen their **pencil grip develop** with the use of handwriting tools to a point where the class are now beginning to **practice their joining**. Parents have celebrated with me their 4 year old children being able to **count in two's** and I listened intently to a young boy who eagerly told me all **the mathematical differences** between a square and rectangle, all while predicting real life uses for each shape. Every time I go into Carn Brea class I am bombarded with children sharing their successes of the **'Rainbow challenges'** or getting me to practise my own fine motor skills on the **Funky fingers table!**

Now, as the Headteacher it is easy for me to boast about the virtues of our school, which is why I regularly invite Mark Lees and Karen Brokenshire into Penponds to check on academic standards. Mark recently retired as a senior Headteacher after 30 years as a school leader across the south-west and is now an



Active Learn – maths homework





Dear Parents/Carers,

This year we are taking part in a, 'Run To Lapland' sponsored walk/run which will begin during the week beginning Monday December 4th. **Across the Rainbow MAT, all of our schools are aiming to cover the distance it will take for Santa to travel**

We hold an annual nativity in Penponds. This year it will take place on Sunday 10th December from 4pm in the Square.
