#### Museums at Night - Friday 20th May

Bring a school class or a club to explore the museum for the evening. Enjoy the Victorian clay works, the 26 acres of woodland and the museum exhibits without the crowds! Guided tours of the Victorian clay works are available and FREE with admission (booking required).

#### Creative Writing Project with KEAP

We will soon be recruiting schools for our 3<sup>rd</sup> 'Pit, Porcelain, Paper' creative writing programme, working alongside KEAP and their temendous writers, artists and performers! The project will be delivered in the Autumn term and will focus on creative writing and performance skills development.
