This week's focus: School Improvement Priorities

On Tuesday Mark Lees, Ofsted Inspector and the Rainbow MAT improvement partner, visited the school along with Samantha Jones, our Executive Principal. Mr Lees and Mrs Jones conducted a thorough review of the education provision and the progress made against our targets since February:

- 1. Raise rates of progress for all pupils across the school
- 2. Increase the learning challenge in all lessons
- 3. Establish a learning environment that creates a 'Wow!' factor

The feedback received from Mr Lees was extremely positive and a testament to the effort and hard work the children and staff have put in this year across the school. As with all such visits, more targets and priorities were identified to work on over the next 6 months. The staff are currently planning for next September and reviewing the progress the children have made. The children will bring home their school reports on **Friday 14**th **July** and there will be a report 'tea party' the following week to discuss the report with your child's class teacher.



Antony James – Olympic Swimmer visit

On Monday the whole school took part in a sponsored fitness circuit led by medal winner Antony James, who took part in the London 2012 Olympic games Butterfly stroke race. Antony led the classes through all the circuits and then led an inspiring assembly where he talked about what it takes to be an elite athlete and a professional

swimmer. He told the children that you only need 2 things to achieve anything you want to in life: motivation and effort. He has spent most of his childhood getting up at 0500 to swim for three hours each morning and had worked out that leading up to the Olympics he had completed 1,330,450 swimming stokes as practice! When he was a toddler he had drawn a poster of the Olympic rings and looked at it every day to keep him focused on his goal.



Cornwall Music Education Hub

Do you have children in your school or a child who is interested in joining us from September 2017?

We run two choirs for Key Stage 2 and lower Key Stage 3 singers and one choir for singers in year 9 and above:

- Cornwall Boys' Choir (CBC) for boys with un-changed treble voice, in academic Year 4 through to changing voice
- Cornwall Girls' Choir (CGC) for girls singing in academic Year 5 upwards to the end of Year 8
- Cornwall County Youth Choir (CCYC) for students in Year 9 and above (male and female singers)

All Cornwall County Boys and Girls Choirs (CBC & CGC) are managed and organised into what we call Local Regional Rehearsal Groups which are located across Cornwall. These groups meet after school during the week, term time only, for one hour.

We endeavour to make being part of the choirs as easy as possible as we understand how busy it can be for parents juggling life and work schedules.

Full choir rehearsals are the exciting occasions when all local rehearsal groups come together. In addition, the Cornwall County Youth Choir rehearses once a month for a whole day in Truro, based at Truro High School for Girls. These are socially important and enable the children to make new friends. Rehearsals take place at Truro High School for Girls, once a month, on Saturday afternoons.

We hold an annual County Choirs Christmas Concert and perform in the Cornwall Music Education Hub (CMEH) Songfest Schools Gala concerts which take place in the spring term. We also hold a showcase event in the summer term, offering families to give the opportunity to see what their child has learnt throughout the year. The CBC also participates in the Cornwall International Male Choral Festival with whom we have a long standing and important relationship.

We occasionally receive offers to perform in unexpected prestigious invitations, sometimes at short notice, so they may not always appear in our yearly plans.

Membership Fees:

Cornwall Boys' and Girls' Choirs - Annual membership fee is £80 for the full academic year. Cornwall County Youth Choir - Annual membership fee is £100 for the full academic year.

Please note that membership fees are payable at the start of the year and are non-refundable. We offer subsidised fees for children eligible for Free School Meals (not including infant universal entitlement), Children in Care and Children of serving Armed Forces


