#### **Harvest Festival**

Our annual celebration of Harvest Festival will take place in the school hall on **Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> October at 1430.** The school will come together to celebrate and give thanks with each class contributing to the celebration and food collection. At the end of the assembly the Year 6 will auction off the food collection with the raised funds going to a charity chosen by the new school council. Accelerated Reader is an online learning tool the school uses to track children's reading. When children in KS2 finish a book they take an online comprehension and often a vocabulary quiz on the content, characters and action in the book. As this builds up over

time children can become word millionaires, as the program counts all the words they have understood. Last year the school read approximately 25 million words, which is a fantastic achievement. This year our school target is 30 million words.

#### School Priorities 2016-2017

The staff have been working hard with the Rainbow Multi-Academy trust and our school improvement advisors to establish our priorities for this year. They are: to raise the rates of progress for all pupils across the school; to increase the learning challenge in all lessons; to establish a learning environment that creates a 'Wow' factor. We will update you on our plans, actions and what impact we have had towards our priorities on a regular basis.

#### **Penponds Speaks**

Mrs Oxford will be returning again this year to organise Penponds Speaks. Children in Trencom and Tregonning class are invited to take part by preparing a speech to be delivered to a parent audience at 6pm on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> November and Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> November. The format will be the same as previous years and the children will have had the details in a letter this week – it's also on the website. This leads into the Camborne Youth Speaks competition later on in the school year.

# Rainbow MAT London Trip, 19th to 21st June 2017



There are still places available on the London trip for year 5 and year 6. The trip takes in the Houses of Parliament, Lego Land, a West End show, the London Eye, a Thames boat trip, the Tower of London and St Pauls
