Active Learn – maths homework



Years 2

to 6 have all now been set up on <u>www.activelearnprimary.co.uk</u> for maths homework. Your child can show you how to log in: **Username:** first 4 letters of first name followed by first 4 letters of surname **Password:** changeme **School code:** hk9w

The games, videos and activities that are set by the teachers each week tie into the maths learning in school in a fun and interactive way. Most activities work on a tablet or laptop although some games require Flashplayer which limits use on an ipad. Feedback is sent directly to the teachers and the children earn rewards which they can use to customise their area. We have an Active Learn trainer coming to school on **Wednesday 29th November at 3.30 to 4pm** to go over key features of the homework and answer any questions you have.
