#### This week's focus: Maths Parent information evening – Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> May at 1730 to



**1830.** Ever wondered how maths is taught in school? Ever been flummoxed by your child's homework? Did you struggle with maths yourself as a child? Then come along to our maths information evening this Tuesday from 5.30 to 6.30pm in the hall. Maths teaching in primary education has gone through some radical changes over the last decade, with new initiatives from government and cutting-edge research into learning all effecting how these vital skills are

taught to our children. On Tuesday evening we hope to clearly demonstrate how strategies are taught in school to embed children's understanding of number. We are

very lucky to have secured the services of Daniel Simons, from Trewirgie Junior school, who will lead the session. Dan was previously Head of Maths at Pool Academy and has delivered training throughout the south-west and in South Africa. He works closely with the Cornwall Maths Hub as well as developing innovative teaching strategies allowing children to secure their understanding. The session will be



hands on, interactive and full of top tips to help your child conquer the subject. Please come along with the whole family and there will be refreshments available throughout the session.
