# 10 Interesting facts about Honey Bees



2. The Queen Bee has the all important job of laying eggs to create the next generation of bees, but that is not where her skills end. Queens also keep the hives in order by releasing chemicals that regulate the behaviour of all the other bees-she is not to be messed with!

Bees must visit 2 million flowers to make 1lb of honey, meaning one hive of bees will fly over 55,000 miles to produce it. On average one hive can produce up to 100lbs of honey each year.

4. Have you ever wondered how honeybees can buzz so loudly? Well, their wings stroke a staggering 11,400 times per minute, that's how.



5. Honeybees communicate via dancing, how cool is that?
To inform worker bees of the location of their food sources, bees perform a set of movements known as the 'waggle dance talk'.

 On average, the queen bee lays between 2000 and 3000 eggs per day. Now we know the true meaning of being as busy as a bee.



7. Although drones can live for up to 4 months, once they have mated they will die immediately.

8. It is only female bees that **sting** as male honeybees do not have a stinger!

9. Over 70% of crops grown around the world are pollinated by bees, so it weren't for bees there would not be enough food to feed everyone.





10. Bees can detect human pheromones that we release when we are scared. The bees will know that their hive is in danger and will begin to attack if you intrude.

### Camborne Trevithick Day 28th April

Trevithick Day traditions, absent for several years, will be re-established at this year's festival. The children's Bal Maidens and Miners dance will once again be led by a half-sized engine with miniature engines following the children. Once more the afternoon dance will be led by a road locomotive with honours going to last year's winner of the "Stuart Solomon Memorial Cup", Martin True's Aveling and Porter Steam Roller. During the winter, Martin's two sons, Joe and Ben, fitted the roller with a brand new canopy. This will be a poignant and lasting memorial to Ben who has since tragically passed away. Of special interest is Colin Savage's Garret 4CD Steam Tractor, "Leslie" built in 1929, this remarkable machine has met the challenge of travelling from John O'Groats to Lands' End. The engine has had a total rebuild, taking eight years to complete. This year's programme cover features Martin True's Aveling and Porter steam roller. Graham Winter, vice-chair and programme editor said "We've a bumper issue this year with over forty pages packed with articles and pictures, which makes it a bargain at only a pound! They'll be on sale throughout the town soon, and on the day.". The Camborne Piskies Explorer Scouts will be selling them on a profit sharing basis. Those using the Park and Ride will get a complimentary copy. The AA are signposting the park & ride from the A30 and the Cornwall Bus Preservation Society are providing the buses while the Veor Rugby Club are manning the gate.

The Camborne Trevithick Day Committee are delighted with the response they've had regarding the new flags. Steve Kingstone, flag-coordinator, said "We won first place with "Tesco's Bags of Help" giving us a whopping start of four thousand pounds, grants have come from groups like Camborne Old Cornwall Society, Centenary Arts and the Flower Festival, Camborne Regeneration Forum, and generous donations via crowdfunding Added to this there has been a two thousand pound grant from The Cornwall Heritage Trust. Response from the traders in the town has been tremendous, all have been delighted that their old Christmas tree holders are going to be put to such good use. No one has yet refused us and some have offered donations, while others are installing holders so they can also fly a flag. We are nearing the capacity of the one hundred flags ordered from the local firm Sailflags of Goldsithney". Matching bunting is still available to buy for anyone wishing to decorate their premises. Face 2 Face is a free and confidential service linking parents and carers of children with additional needs and disabilities with local parent befrienders. We know how reassuring it can be to speak to someone who understands. All our volunteers are a parent or carer of a child with additional needs or disability too. Our volunteer parent befrienders receive training and on-going support. Befrienders support parents through what can sometimes be difficult and confusing experiences.

Over the last 16 years Face 2 Face has been offering emotional support and signposting to parents and carers of children with additional needs and disabilities. The service has been managed by Scope and funded by the Big Lottery. Scope's involvement with the service will finish at the end of March 2018.

Friends of Face 2 Face Cornwall was set up 8 years ago to raise funds to host children's Christmas parties, summer family fun days and carers events. Having now obtained charity status with the express intention of keeping this valuable service running, Friends of Face 2 Face Cornwall are actively fundraising to continue the work of Face 2 Face.

Friends of Face 2 Face Cornwall will run drop in Oasis groups around the Mid and West of Cornwall. These groups are free, friendly and informal. Groups are held regularly – some weekly, some monthly. Parents, carers or family members can attend with your child, their siblings or on your own.
