# **Key Priorities**

Every year the staff and governors carefully analyse our school's performance and compare it to national standards. This helps identify what the school is doing well and what it must do to improve. The staff then focus on particular actions working towards these priorities. These are regularly monitored by looking at the children's work, checking on their assessments and of course, talking to the children! This year one of our key priorities is maths, in particular how children apply their knowledge and reasoning skills to maths problems. Mrs Lawlor, our maths subject leader, ensures consistency across the school and leads staff training in new concepts and strategies. Children carry





out a whole class investigation each week using a particular method for problem solving. In Year 5/6 the children have learnt, 'open-ended problem solving' where there is more than one answer for a problem. Here's an example to try:

Maisy, Sarah and Freddie are children in the same family. The product of their ages is 20. How old might they be?

### **Penponds Garden Revival 2018**

As many of you may be aware the garden is slowly taking shape with stage one of the instillation of a new garden shed, giving us a secure place to lock tools away and for the children to pot on plants and make plans for how they want their outdoor learning environment.

The next stage of the project was the purchase of a poly tunnel - our outdoor classroom. Its main frame is up and secure with the help of some parents; as you may have seen from the photos. The aim now is to arrange a Sunday morning in the coming month to complete the construction of the poly tunnel. If you are available on the dates suggested and would like to be involved, then could you let Jo Wood in the office know so we can get hold of everyone the night before to confirm we are going to do the build. Mr Kilpin has kindly offered to build some raised beds so that we can grow other vegetables this spring and summer so we would also love you to get involved with the next stage. He has offered to level out our growing area by digging it over and construct some raised beds.

As you may be aware in the autumn term, we had several fund raising events with the contribution and family help of the Floyd family. We have raised money to purchase several tonnes of top soil and have some manure donated from the Wills family. Some of the vegetables we grew last year were a success and we will be growing more Cavero Nero (Kale), Corn and peas. Unfortunately, the courgettes were not a huge winner due to location and soil suitability. We will also have a chance of growing strawberries in the poly tunnel, and have some summer and winter raspberries, gooseberries and blackcurrants.

Penponds would like to enhance the bee population to help pollinate the crops, but the aim is to rotavate and prepare an area to plant wild flowers.

Thank you for all your support and hard work so far; these are the first stages of building our fabulous outdoor learning environment.
