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



Covid Update

Please see the useful guidance from the NHS on symptoms

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

- 1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
- 2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result. If your test is negative you are able to stop self isolating.

If your child has a cold or is feeling slightly under the weather they are able to come in to school if they feel well enough to do so. The guidance is clear that it is only children with the symptoms listed above that should not be coming into school. We will keep you updated as and when guidance changes. We will inform you if there is a confirmed case of Covid in your child's bubble and advise you of what to do next.

Keep your child safe online

Whilst there are huge benefits to being online in order to stay connected to family and friends during this period, the government recognises many parents may feel concerned about the activities and content their children are accessing. It is important to have regular conversations about staying safe online and to encourage children to speak to you if they come across something worrying online.

These resources provide guidance for parents and carers to keep children safe online. They will, amongst other things, support you to talk to your child about a range of online safety issues, set up home filtering in a child-friendly way and set up age-appropriate parental controls on digital devices:

- <u>Childnet</u> has developed <u>guidance for parents and carers</u> to begin a conversation about online safety, as well as <u>guidance on keeping under-</u> fives safe online
- <u>Parent Info</u> is a collaboration between Parent Zone and NCA-CEOP, providing support and guidance for parents and carers related to the digital world from leading experts and organisations
- NSPCC has <u>guidance for parents and carers</u> to help keep children safe online
- <u>UK Safer Internet Centre</u> provides tips and advice for parents and carers to keep children safe online - you can also <u>report any harmful content</u> found online through the UK Safer Internet Centre
