This week's focus: Penponds School Lantern Making



On Monday and Tuesday this week Trencrom class made the Camborne Parade lantern for the school. We had decided to make a lantern shape as the theme is, 'The Night Before Christmas'. First of all, we twisted the willows for making the frame and Amanda and Mrs Rowe used the twisted sticks construct the shape. When the frame was together it really started to look like a lantern. On Tuesday

we bought in old clothes so we didn't get too messy. Then we got shown how to make the paper gluey for sticking onto the frame. Amanda showed us how to make it gluey enough without having any puddles. We gave Amanda and Mrs Rowe the gluey paper and they managed to cover the whole frame in the paper. After the whole frame had been covered in paper, we put black paper and stars onto the white paper so it looked like a real lantern. We even made some flames to go on top of the candle in the lantern with black stripes to go around the edges.





# 7 questions to help you start a conversation with your child about online safety





Which apps/games are you using at the moment?

THIS WILL GIVE YOU A GOOD OVERVIEW OF THE TYPES OF THINGS YOUR CHILDRE ARE DOING ON THEIR DEVICES, ALONG WITH THEIR INTERESTS. REMEMBER THAT THEY MIGHT NOT TELL YOU EVERYTHING THEY ARE USING, SO IT IS A GOOD IDEA TO ASH THEM TO SHOW YOU THEIR DEVICE. BECAUSE NEW APPS AND GAMES RELEASED REGULARLY, IT IS IMPORTANT TO HAVE THIS CONVERSATION OFTEN THE ENSURE YOU ARE UP TO DATE WITH WHAT THEY ARE DOING.



AS IN THE TIP ABOVE, ASKING THIS QUESTION WILL ALLOW YOU TO FIND OUT WHAT YOUR CHILD IS DOING ONLINE, AND ENCOURAGE POSITIVE CONVERSATIONS ABOUT THEIR ONLINE ACTIVITY. ASK THEM HOW THEY USE THE WEBSITES, AND TAKE AN INTEREST IN HOW THEY CAN USE THEM IN A POSITIVE WAY, ALSO ASKING THEM TO SHOW YOU IF POSSIBLE.





How does this game/app work?

Can I play?

SHOW A GENUINE INTEREST IN WHAT THEY ARE DOING. WHILST YOU ARE PLAYING A GAME OR USING AN APP WITH THEM, IT MIGHT HIGHLIGHT SOMETHING THAT THEY DON'T NECESSARILY THINK IS A DANGER TO THEM, IF THEY ACT LINE THEY DON'T WANT TO SHARE THEIR ACTIVITIES WITH YOU, QUESTION WHY.










ALTHOUGH YOU MAY BE THE ADULT THEY TRUST THE MOST. SOME CHILDREN STRUGGLE TO TALH ABOUT WHAT HAPPENS ONLINE DUE TO CONFUSION OR EMBARRASSMENT. BECAUSE OF THIS THEY MAY STRUGGLE TO APPROACH THE NORMAL PEOPLE WHO WOULD HELP, SUCH AS YOURSELF OR A TEACHER. HAVE A CHAT TO YOUR CHILD ABOUT EXACTLY WHERE THEY CAN GO FOR HELP, AND HOW THEY CAN REPORT ANY ACTIVITY THAT THEY BELIEVE IS INAPPROPRIATE ONLINE.

Do you know what your personal information is?

R CHILD MAY ALREADY HNOW WHAT THEIR PERSONAL INFORMATION IS BUT Y MIGHT NOT THINH ABOUT HOW IT CAN BE SHARED. HAVE A CONVERSATION WHAT PERSONAL INFORMATION IS AND HOW THIS CAN AFFECT THEM IF IT IS IEED BEYOND THE INTENDED RECIPIENT. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOUR CHILD DERSTANDS THE DANGERS OF SHARING CONTACT DETAILS OR PHOTOS, AS INFORMATION SUCH AS THIS CAN SPREAD QUICHLY ONLINE.
