Community Governor vacancy

One of our long serving governors, Mr Derek Head, is stepping down at the end of this term. Derek has been serving the school community of Penponds for a number or years and has brought much challenge and support to the staff to ensure the children of Penponds fulfill their potential. His expertise in behaviour for learning, assessments and particularly maths have helped us make rapid improvements and I'd like to thank him personally for the time and effort he has put into our school.

As Derek is standing down we have a vacancy for a Community Governor starting in September 2019. Governors are all volunteers and make up the biggest volunteer sector in England. They attend 6 meetings a year, visit the school to observe standards and meet with staff to discuss impact of various teaching strategies. Governors challenge and support school leaders and take a strategic view of how the school is improving the life chances for children. It is a very rewarding role and training, networking and forums are available for governors to develop their skills and knowledge. Most governors also bring an area of expertise to the school's governing body, often closely linked to their own profession or employment. This position is a community governor vacancy - not a parent governor role.
