


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John Couch Adams animation project

Parking - Please keep all children safe

Please park considerately and safely out on the road and preferably not on the hatchings in front of the gate. This will ensure it is safe for cars to pull out on to the road from the car park. Also, when parking in the car park please try to reverse into the space so that you are facing forward when you leave the car park and will have better visibility. The safety of our children is the highest priority.

We would also politely ask parents not to wait on the entrance slope at the beginning and end of the day – this will enable staff to monitor children coming in to school and leaving more effectively.

Surfing Lessons with Global Boarders

On Thursday afternoons Erin, Tristan, Lily, Daniel and myself — Harrison - go surfing at Gwithian. We surf with Global Boarders. First we get changed into our wetsuits. If you don't have a wetsuit they supply one for you, and surfboards. Next we buddy up with two Surfboarders. This is called the Buddy system. While we are at the beach we do pop-ups, that means how to surf. When we are just about to go in, we put our leashes on our back foot. When we are in the sea the coach does the signals.
