# King Edward Mine - Tregonning Class Trip

Tired, excited and interested were the words to describe me on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> February. I had never been to a mining site before and was interested to see what it was like. Arriving at school I could see my class milling about, happily chatting about what was to come. We read for a while, until the 53 seater coach arrived to whisk us to King Edward Mine. The mine was only 5 minutes away, so the coach trip didn't drag. It was a rather beautiful sight when we arrived.



One of the guides sat us down on wobbly stools to give us an introduction. Some rocks and tin were passed around, including iron pyrite (more commonly recognised as Fool's gold). Then we were sorted into two groups. My group went to the mill first. It was quite a walk, but it was worth it. First we saw stamps which were very interesting. The miners used these to crush the ore. Next, we saw the water wheel. It was very large. No-one thought it could get any better, until our guide turned it on! After being reluctantly dragged away from the wheel, we saw the shaking table. Water playfully bounced down the yellow table, splashing the people close to it. On and on we went past marvellous machines, until we got to the museum. Noting the last thing I saw, some headgear, I stepped inside. Our guide gave us each a sheet and we had to complete it.

Finally, it was lunchtime. Mine was enjoyable, especially when we were allowed to play for a few minutes. Then it was time for the challenge. We all had to build some

# **Physical Education**

PE (Physical Education) is an important part of the National Curriculum therefore it is essential that your child has the correct PE kit in school at all times so that they can participate in their weekly PE lessons.

To support us with teaching your child PE, please can you make sure your child has the correct PE kit, all clearly labelled with their name, in a drawstring bag. This needs to be sent into school at the beginning of each term. It will be sent home by the class teacher at the end of the half term to be washed. 'I forgot my PE kit', is not an acceptable excuse for missing PE, neither is having a cold. Children will only be exempt from a PE lesson if parents contact the school beforehand either through class dojo/email, the reading record or a short note.

In your child's PE kit, they should have the following items;

- \*White T-shirt
- \*Red/Black shorts
- \*Black/Grey jogging bottoms or tracksuit
- \*Red school jumper or fleece
- \*Plimsolls/Trainers.

Also all children should have a drinks bottle. We are able to supply these in school.

Prior to participating in a PE lesson, all jewellery must be removed or covered as this could cause a hazard in the PE lesson. Ideally your child should leave the jewellery at home on their PE days. If they are unable to remove earrings, they need to cover them with micro pore tape.

It's important to note that new challenges are arising on the internet all the time. We have created to this guide to raise awareness of the issue and offer advice on helping parents to talk to their children about making safer decisions online. See also our 7 conversation starters guide for more tips on better communication with your child.

Momo is a sinister 'challenge' that has been around for some time. It has recently resurfaced and once again has come to the attention of schools and children across the country. Dubbed the 'suicide killer game', Momo has been heavily linked with apps such as Facebook, WhatsApp, YouTube, and most recently (and most worryingly)... YouTube Kids. The scary doll-like figure reportedly sends graphic violent images, and asks users to partake in dangerous challenges like waking up at random hours and has even been associated with self-harm. It has been reported that the 'Momo' figure was originally created as a sculpture and featured in an art gallery in Tokyo and unrelated to the 'Momo' challenge we are hearing about in the media.

What parents need to know about



There have been recent reports that some seemingly innocent videos on YouTube and YouTube Kids (such as 'surprise eggs', unboxing videos and Minecraft videos) have been edited by unknown sources to include violence provoking and/or other inappropriate content. Even though You'lube monitor and remove videos that include inappropriate content, clips can be uploaded and viewed thousands of times before they get reported and removed. As a parent, it's difficult to spot these videos as the harmful content doesn't appear until partway through the video.

Popular YouTubers and other accounts have been uploading reaction videos, showing their experience of the MOMO challenge. Some of the videos include a disclosure message warning that the content may be "Inappropriate or offensive to some audiences" and that "viewer discretion is advised" but these videos are still easily accessed by clicking 'I understand and wish to proceed. The image of the 'Momo' character can be deeply distressing to children and wome people and it's children and young people and it's important to note that it may slip through parental settings and filters.

# SUGGESTED VIDEOS

Video apps such as YouTube include an 'up next' feature which automatically starts playing another video based on the video just watched. Due to YouTube's algorithm, users are shown 'suggested videos' that they may be interested in. The thumbnalls used on suggested videos are purposefully created in a way to encourage viewers to click them. During our research, we found that when watching one Momo related video we were shown countless other. video, we were shown countless other Momo themed videos and other scary content which would be age-inappropriate for children under 18.
