

#### Year 5 visit to Tolvaddon Fire Station for Junior Life Skills event



On Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> March Year 5 went to Tolvaddon Fire Station. We travelled there on a bus from CSIA and got into three groups of four. After that we all went to different stations that had been set up in the hall. The first station was about the light – electricity. We talked about the danger of electricity. Then we moved to the next station. It was about road safety – we should always wear a seatbelt. The next was about the RNLI

lifeguards who keep you safe in the sea when you are swimming or surfing. We got to wear all the safety equipment, hats, sunglasses, walkie-talkies and lifejackets. The next one was about how to be safe on a train. We saw what happened when a rock was thrown at a train driver – the person who threw the rock was arrested and went to prison! The next story was about a girl who was playing chicken when the train was coming. She slipped on the tracks and the train ran over her! We moved onto internet

safety and how to stay safe online. We learnt that we shouldn't share pictures over the internet and not to pretend who we aren't. The last station was about how to keep your house safe with things like fire alarms, telephones and fire blankets. We also learnt why it is important to shut doors in the house so the fire doesn't spread in the house. It was a really fun morning and we met lots of people who work for the fire brigade, the


#### **Sponsored Read**




