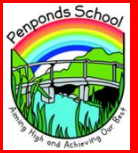




PENPONDS PRIMARY SCHOOL

MARCH PUPIL SAFEGUARDING SNAPSHOT



Each month Leaders ask a cross section of children questions relating to safeguarding. The questions asked support us in ensuring that the school is a safe and secure place for the children to learn and develop. We feel it is important to know the views of the pupils and also identify any gaps and address them accordingly.

QUESTION	RESPONSE
If you felt unsafe or unhappy at school what would you do?	Tell an adult Ask a friend to help me Try and sort it out myself then ask a s teacher Tell mum, next friend, the teacher
If there was an emergency at school, what would you do?	Tell a teacher Get as many people as I can to be safe Go to the court The fire alarm would go off There is a fire extinguisher in our room
How do you keep safe when using the computer?	Don't talk to random people Don't put drinks near it Not have whatsapp Keep charger close so no one trip
What does online safety mean to you? Why is it important?	Don't give out personal information like phone number, house number, address Do not text people you don't know Delete/block apps that are not good. We had a conversation about how school filters do this for us.
If a friend is worried about an issue outside of school what would you do?	Calm them down, tell them to calm down Advise them to tell a parent or teacher Write it down Worry box – some younger children said that they did not know what a worry box was and the older children offered to make them one for their classroom after explaining what it was and how it works.
What would you do if you were worried about a test you were about to take?	Don't get stressed, take deep breaths Tell dad/sister Tell teacher/friend

<p>What does healthy living mean to you?</p>	<p>Eat healthy food Eat food from the green half of eat well plate Eat, water, air Sleep Dharman videos on YouTube – a child explained that these videos were useful to give advice about keeping healthy.</p>
<p>What does the word respect mean to you?</p>	<p>Don't answer back to adults Help people and don't say no if someone asks for help Not breaking secrets – a child said that being respectful meant not breaking secrets but we discussed situations where it might help someone</p>
<p>If you are in a disagreement what is the best way to solve it?</p>	<p>Walk away Respect differences Help to sort out Told the teacher, sort it out, speak to class Hug it out. Shake hands</p>
<p>What does the word tolerance mean to you?</p>	<p>Like lions, mother tolerant of cubs, If you are being annoyed by someone, walk away, ignore it. Tell them they are not supposed to do something Explain differences</p>
<p>How do you know that you are doing the right things at school?</p>	<p>Read and follow Bee rules A teacher will tell you Ask if you are allowed to do something</p>
<p>Can you name any of the rights you have as children?</p>	<p>Relax and play Fresh air Don't be disturbed Voice Be a child and play Sleep education</p>
