Dear Parents/Carers

It's a testament to the variety of working in primary education that I am sat in a field at Porthpean camp writing this reflection on our year at school! Although very early, a group of our year 6 are playing badminton, others are singing in their tent and some are making new friends on a viewing platform over-looking St Austell bay.

As a school, we can celebrate many successes this year. Academically we are above the national average in all of the key attainment and progress measures throughout primary education. I am particularly proud of our reception children, who have made amazing progress this year and produced some brilliant outcomes. As a class they have all worked very hard and it has been a privilege to be so closely involved in their first year at school. Also, we have achieved the Healthy schools award, the school council award, were second in the south-west finals of Youth Speaks and in the Camborne choir festival to name a few.

Today we say goodbye to our Year 6 children. They have become an exceptional group of young people and have helped shape the direction of the school during their time at Penponds. Their effort, motivation and enthusiasm was realised not just with their outstanding results in the Key Stage 2 SAT's, but by having a confident, curious and creative approach to learning. They have played such a big part in the life of the whole school community and have been wonderful role models to the younger children. As staff we will miss their sense of humour, infectious enthusiasm and willingness to have a go. We are very proud of the young adults they have become.

As well as children moving on some of our staff are leaving too. Mrs Howe, one of our Learning Assistants in Carn Brea class, is retiring. She has been involved in Cornish education for over 20 years and taught thousands of children. Mrs Howe has been a rock in our reception class and used her impressive experience and skills to teach our youngest pupils key concepts without them actually realising they are learning. She has passed on many pearls of wisdom to the staff and entertained many with her anecdotes at lunchtime.

Mrs Evans, our finance assistant, is also retiring. She has worked tirelessly in the office (and as a lunchtime supervisor) to support myself and Mrs Wood in dealing with the mountains of paperwork that schools seem to generate. Her calm, professional demeanour and wealth of experience have been much needed with the rate of change confronting all schools at present. Her quick wit and Yorkshire sense of humour have brightened up many situations!

Miss Marsh is also moving on to pastures new. She has worked diligently this year to complete our successful application for the Healthy Schools award and persuaded many parents to give up their Sundays to build our Poly tunnel and complete the garden area. Miss Marsh has strong relationships with all the children as she has covered most classes at various points and the teachers always appreciate her baking with wholesome ingredients from her garden.
