Each month Leaders ask a cross section of children questions relating to safeguarding. The questions asked support us in ensuring that the school is a safe and secure place for the children to learn and develop. We feel it is important to know the views of the pupils and also identify any gaps and address them accordingly.

QUESTION	RESPONSE
<b>If you felt unsafe or unhappy at school what would you do?</b>	Tell the teacher Ask a friend and they could look after you See prefects Family member
<b>If there was an emergency at school, what would you do?</b>	Go straight to the court Tell the teacher, go out of the exit Single file Get a teacher We learnt this at the fire station – see if they are breathing – lots of conversation around the trip to the fire station and what they learnt
<b>How do you keep safe when using the computer?</b>	Tell an adult before you go on Don't search anything that could be harmful or not child friendly If it looks "sus", go off it Don't download without telling an adult If you search anything rude it will flag up for Mrs. Bailey Don't google anything rude
<b>What does online safety mean to you? Why is it important?</b>	If you tell someone your personal details, they may come and get you Don't tell anything about your family Losing money Don't even tell pets name Tell an adult immediately – tell the police Scam viruses Don't want be scared
<b>If a friend is worried about an issue outside of school what would you do?</b>	Tell the teacher, contact the parents or the police Give them a hug Tell parents

<p><b>What would you do if you were worried about a test you were about to take?</b></p>	<p>Ask someone to look after you  Tell an adult  Reassurance from friends, teachers, prefects, family, anyone that you know  Put it in the worry box</p>
<p><b>What does healthy living mean to you?</b></p>	<p>Eat fruit and veg  Not being hungry  Brush your teeth  Dentist checkup  Keep fit  exercise</p>
<p><b>What does the word respect mean to you?</b></p>	<p>Respect talking  Be selfless  Don't be mean  Respecting skill or talent  Parents thy do so much for you</p>
<p><b>If you are in a disagreement what is the best way to solve it?</b></p>	<p>You can stay away from them, if you make a nice card and be nice  Try again  Say everyone forget about it. – it only small  Mr Hooper said apologise even if it is hard  Walk away  Tell an adult, say sorry</p>
<p><b>What does the word tolerance mean to you?</b></p>	<p>Accept tem for who they are  You can't tolerate someone if they ae annoying you</p>
