Our aim for the Geography curriculum is to ensure that all children are inspired to be curious and fascinated about the world and its people. • Our children will be given the knowledge they need to learn about diverse places, people, resources and the environment. • Our broad and balanced curriculum is designed to develop knowledge, understanding and skills that are progressive as well as transferable to further education and beyond. • Our children will be equipped with the vocabulary that they need to become geographers and ask questions about our world. • Our curriculum is designed to develop knowledge, understanding and skills that are progressive from EYFS to Year 6. • Our children will use the outdoor environment to develop their geographical skills and fieldwork.	To ensure that high quality geography is taking place throughout the whole school we implement a curriculum which is progressive from EYFS through to Year 6. • Geography lessons are planned through termly topics with a focus on knowledge, understanding and skills. • Geography lessons have a strong focus on vocabulary which ensures that all children are able to talk about geography using the appropriate language. The use of vocabulary is progressive from EYFS to Year 6. • The subject leaders work closely alongside teachers to ensure that knowledge, understanding and skills within geography lessons are progressive through the school. • Children will use resources to support their learning, for example, atlases, text books, maps, digital resources • Our monitoring system, including planning scrutiny, book looks, subject coverage checks, lesson observations and pupil conferencing will enable the curriculum leaders to check coverage and progression.	 Children will be able to talk about geography and use geographical language to discuss what they have learnt. Books will show progress in knowledge and skills from the beginning of a topic to the end. Children will feel inspired and curious about geography and want to find out more about their world. Children will be aware of geography in their local area and they will be able to understand how it has been shaped around them. Children will be able to describe and understand the key aspects of human and physical geography.
