






Donation of Books

FOPS

On Wednesday Mrs Bailey invited any family members from the school community to attend a meeting to try and relaunch the Friends of Penponds School group. The Friends of Penponds (FOPs) raises money to enable the school to pay for events, facilities or equipment outside the normal school budget, and therefore advance the education of the children.

Furthermore, FOPs support events that promote a friendly and social atmosphere between all children, staff, parents/carers, governors and the local community. We had two parents join Mrs Watts and Mrs Bailey, with a couple of other parents unable to make the meeting, but emailing to say they were interested in being involved.

We discussed the future structure of FOPs, with the understanding that some people can commit to every meeting and every event, whereas others may not be able to. We decided to attempt to have a Core Committee (those that can do lots!) and Sub-committee or Pool of Helpers who may be able to commit to one event etc.

We then managed to begin the planning of two events – both to occur this half term for the children!

 Holi Rainbow Red Nose and Spoon Race - Comic Relief event to coincide with RE teaching of Hindu festival of Holi - Friday 18th March 2022 (separate details in this newsletter)

2. Easter Movie Night - Thursday 7th April

All children invited to stay after school. Bring a pillow, blanket and cuddly toy to snuggle up and watch a movie together. FOPs will provide popcorn, drink and small chocolate Easter egg per child.

There will be a charge of £2.50 to attend this event to be paid via Parent Pay – sign up details to follow!

We also discussed a larger event for the summer of a Summer Disco, however we will need a few more helpers in order to put this event on.

Comic Relief (Red Nose Day and Holi) – 18th March 2022

We will be fundraising like the rest of the country for Comic Relief on 18th March. The 18th March is also the Hindu festival of Holi. Many of our children have been learning about Hinduism in their RE lessons and we felt that we would try and mark both events together. Holi is the festival of love, colours and spring and it is traditionally celebrated by people getting very colourful by throwing powder paint and getting very messy and

You may have heard that The One Show are taking part in the Red Nose and Spoon Race Challenge (details here <u>The Red Nose and Spoon Race | Comic Relief</u>) and we felt that we could do our own version in school and link it to learning about Holi too.

All children will be invited to come to school wearing old light-coloured clothing. Each class will then take part in a Red nose and spoon race, where they will attempt to keep a Red Nose on their spoon as they go around the course. The course will have a Holi theme where children will run the course with water and powder paint thrown! Colourful sunglasses will also be provided to run the course. All children will go home with a Comic Relief Red Nose and their colourful clothes as a memento from the day.

We are asking for a contribution of £2.50 – with proceeds going towards Comic Relief and FOPS.

Our new relaunched FOPS (Friends of Penponds School) have kindly agreed to help fund this event by purchasing the powder paint and sunglasses. Thank you for your kind support FOPS!

Rights Respecting School

As you know we have been learning about Children's Rights as detailed in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child this year. Our school council are leading on this in school and we are also focusing on children's rights in assemblies too.

Our whole school contributed to choosing these five articles from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child to focus on:

Article 12 - Right to a Voice

Article 15 - Right to meet with friends and join clubs

Article 28 - Right to an education

Article 29 - Right to be the best you can be


Article 31 - Right to relax and play.



Our whole school learnt about many rights in assemblies. In assembly, we made a long-list of the rights the children wanted to focus on in school and then School Council: Rights Ambassadors chose the final five.

Following this a whole school charter was created—an agreement, with all signing up to respect our own and other's rights. This was designed by our School Council: Rights Ambassadors. Children chose to sign the charter by using their handprints in the shape of a rainbow to reflect being part of the Rainbow MAT family and handprints to be inclusive. All children in our school could sign up with a handprint. Children do not have any responsibility in order to access their rights as rights are unconditional. Children are the Rights Holders and adults are the Duty Bearers to uphold children's rights.

Our charter is not a set of rules, but is a visual reminder of our agreement; to strive to develop responsible behaviours through respecting our rights and those of others.



New School Curriculum needs a new name!

Our curriculum has recently been under review to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on our children's learning.

We know that remote learning is no substitute to children learning in the classroom alongside their peers, supported by teachers and learning professionals.

Following curriculum coverage checks of what had been taught in school and through remote learning, we decided to undertake a full curriculum review. This was especially important with a rolling curriculum programme (Year A and Year B curriculum) and mixed age classes.

Your amazing teachers have now completed this work and now it needs a name – something a little more exciting than, 'The Penponds School Curriculum'.

The curriculum belongs to the children, so it should be named by them, the Penponds children!

We want the name to be special to Penponds. We have planned it to be:

- Enjoyable
- Memorable
- Well Sequenced
- Have real-life hands-on experiences
- Hooks old and new learning together
- Have lots of links across subjects
- Build knowledge and skills for life



What is the Local Governing Body's Role?

The Local Governing Body of our school plays a key role in:

A parent governor is not a delegate and does not speak 'on behalf' of the parent body. The role and responsibilities of parent governors are no different from those of the other governors.

The Local Governing Body meets every half-term, the meetings are held in the evening and run for approximately 2 hours. The term of office is 4 years.

As well as attending meetings governors are also asked to look at specific areas of the school's work in more detail and report back to the Local Governing Body.

To help support governors, everyone has access to further training to help build on existing skills or to develop new ones.

Eligibility to stand as a parent governor – you must be a parent or carer of a registered pupil of the academy.

Reasons for Disqualification

A person is disqualified from holding or from continuing to hold office as a governor or associate member if he or she:


- is under the age of 18
- is subject to a bankruptcy restriction order, an interim bankruptcy restriction order, a debt relief order or an interim debt relief order;
- has had his or her estate sequestrated and the sequestration order has not been discharged, annulled or reduced;

- is subject to:
 - a disqualification order or disqualification undertaking under the Company Directors
 Disqualification Act 1986
 - ii) a disqualification order under Part 2 of the Companies (Northern Ireland) Order 1989
 - iii) a disqualification undertaking accepted under the Company Directors Disqualification (Northern Ireland) Order 2002
 - iv) an order made under Section 429(2)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1986 (failure to pay under a County Court administration order);
- has been removed from the office of charity trustee or trustee for a charity by the Charity Commissioners or High Court on grounds of any misconduct or mismanagement, or under Section 34 of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 from participating in the management or control of any body;
- is included in the list of people considered by the Secretary of State as unsuitable to work with children;
- is disqualified from working with children or subject to a direction under Section 142 of the Education Act 2002;
- is disqualified from registration for childminding or providing day care;
- is disqualified from registration under Part 3 of the Childcare Act 2006;
- has received a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of not less than three months (without the option of a fine) in the five years before becoming a governor or since becoming a governor;
- has received a prison sentence of two-and-a-half years or more in the 20 years before becoming a governor;
- has at any time received a prison sentence of five years or more;
- has been fined for causing a nuisance or disturbance on school premises during the five years prior to or since appointment or election as a governor;
- refuses to allow an application to the Criminal Records Bureau for a criminal records certificate.

Please also note that your details will be placed on our computer database. Your data will be used in accordance with the principles set out in the Data Protection Act (DPA) 1998. This data will only be used for internal purposes including sharing with members, governing bodies and for mailing information to you as and when required.

By signing below you are confirming that the above details are correct, that none of the reasons for disqualification apply, you are the parent/carer of a registered pupil at the academy school and that this information may be used in accordance with data protection regulations.






