
Cycle-wise

The school have been lucky enough to be selected for free Cycle-wise training in the summer term provided by the police. The normal programme of cycle training, called Bike-ablity, was cut by 50% this year which meant that ceratin groups of children were unable to complete their course. One of the school governors, Sarah Davis, spent a lot of time searching for an alternative which has now been confirmed. Also, Dave from Sustrans has agreed to provide free cycle skills coaching to the younger classes as well as relaunching our school balance bikes. A huge thank you to Mrs Davis for securing the service for the school.

New shed

We have been examining various ways of improving the storage space in the school and moving resources into the best place so children/staff are able to access equipment in a much easier fashion. Mrs Watts looked into relocating the sports equipment into a shed and through Lee Pengelly, Jewsons have **donated over £800** of materials for a new shed! The shed will be built next week and will be used for storing all of the school's sports equipment closer to the field and inside the gates, allowing the children to begin to use the scooters and balance bikes at break-times and lunchtimes.



How To Book - Step-by-Step

- 1. Visit https://cornwall.thisisads.co.uk/index.php#top
- 2. Log in or register (circled on the below image in Red):

 a. If you have booked Mother's Day or Father's Day messages before click 'Log In' and enter the email address and password set up previously then 'Continue' to log in.
 - b. If you have not booked Mother's Day or Father's Day messages before click 'Register' and enter information into the relevant fields then 'Continue' to register your details.



3. CLASSIFY YOUR AD

After logging in you will be redirected back to the main page, where you can click on the 'Mother's Day' classification, and then either 'Mother's Day Greetings' or 'Mother's Day Remembrance'.

- 4. CHOOSE YOUR DESIGN & PACKAGE Choose the free 'Lineage' option and click 'Continue'.
- ENTER THE ADVERT DETAILS Enter information into the 'Surname', 'First names', 'Message' and 'From' fields then click 'Continue'.
- 6. DATES The date is pre-selected for you, just click 'Continue'.
- REVIEW YOUR ADVERT Click 'Continue' (IMPORTANT: Your advert is not yet complete at this stage)
- YOUR BASKET Your message will be saved only once your advert reaches this stage. If you want to place more than one notice, repeat the steps from number 3.

Once you've placed all of your messages and you're happy with them click 'Submit Adverts' (circled in Red in the image shown below).
