I am delighted to introduce you to our new prefects Olivia and Charlie who will join Isla and Freya in their duties.


Olivia and Charlie are such hardworking individuals and persevere with challenges, always striving to be the best they can be and never give up when things get a little tricky.

Car Parking

We have been contacted by a few parents and members of our community around the issues of parking around the school. Our top priority at all times is to keep our children safe. With this in mind please can we ask that you adhere to the below when dropping off and collecting your children:

- If possible please use the car park at the front of school or at the rear by Little Acorns to reverse park your car and then walk your children in.
- 2. The front car park can be used as a drop off system by entering in the first gate with children alighting and then you leaving by the second gate (for older children).
- 3. If you cannot park in the car park or your children are too young to use the drop off system please ensure you park safely **on** the road near the school.
- 4. Avoid parking on the hashing, pavements, near the junction and please do not block the bus stop.

Please be mindful of those children that are walking, scooting or cycling to school who do not use a car and therefore need access to the pavements at all times and ensure visibility for them at the junctions.

We are really lucky at Penponds with the amount of parking available to us in and around the school compared to other schools. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.
