

CREATE YOUR CHILD'S ACCOUNT
You can create an Apple ID for a child under 13 and add
hent to your family group to keep an eye on their activity,
o to Settings > [your name] > Family Sharing > Add Family
kember > Create a Child Accounts > Next. Enter your child's
rthday and tap Next. Review the Perent Privacy Disclosure
and tap Agree. With Family Sharing, you can add up to six
family members to share App Store purchases, as well as
Trunes and Apple Books.

SWITCH ON 'ASK TO BUY'
you have a child that is over 13 years of age and has their
mapple account, make sure that you only allow them to
keep purchases with gift cards. You can also activate the
sk to Buy' feature if you are using Family Sharing, so that
therever a family member who isn't an adult initiates a
w purchase, a request goes to the secount organiser. You
can also limit what content your child can access on the
devices they use,

RESTRICT IN-APP PURCHASES

You can restrict your child's ability to make in-app purchases. On an IOS device, open Settings, tap General and then Restrictions. Tap Enable Restrictions: You can put a limitation that requires a password every time there is a purchase made in the App Store or iTunes Store.

BROWSE APPS BY AGE
To find apps and games that are right for your children, check the age ratings. On an iPhone or iPod Touch, this can be found in the information section on an app's product page, and on an iPad or desktop, the age range is near the Buy button. On the Kids page, you can find apps for age ranges, including 5 and under, 6 to 8, and 9 to 11.

AVOID OTHER APP STORES
Put a rule in place that your child can only use the official App
Stare to download apps and gomes. Explain why it is wise to
only install applications from a trusted source to ensure thei
device is not affected by security issues or virus attacks.

HOW TO KNOW AN APP IS SAFE TO INSTALL

Achiese your child that just be cause they're downloading an app from an official store, it doesn't make it safe. Fake or copycat apps will often include misspelt words and poor grammar, so always read the app devergition, and double check the developer name and title for warning signs. Be wary of apps that come with a long list of permission requests. Theck the app's reviews and ratings - one star, one-line reviews complaining that an app didn't work on a certain device, or that there was a billing issue, is not a good indication.


